**Title
MPI Application Requirements for Appointment to CID Warrant Officer
(MOS 311A)**

1. This message is effective upon release and will expire NLT 31 May 2021.
 2. The purpose of this message is to establish procedures for the submission of applications for appointment to warrant officer, MOS 311A (CID Special Agent), from Regular Army (RA) Military Police Investigators (31BV5).
 3. This program is open to Regular Army Soldiers who hold MOS 31BV5 in the ranks of SSG, SSG(P), and SFC (non-promotable), have completed V5 training at the U.S. Army Military Police School (USAMPS), and have at least two years of investigative experience in the past four years. Application submission timeframe is from 1

December 2019 through 31 May 2021. Approved applications will be considered by the warrant officer accession board convening in FY20 and FY21.

4. Eligibility requirements. Applicants must meet all of the special agent acceptance criteria as outlined below. Only waivers for education will be considered, all other requirements are non-waiverable.

- a. U.S. Citizenship.
- b. Minimum of a Baccalaureate degree from an accredited institution (waivers will be considered).
- c. General technical (GT) score of 110 or higher and Skill Technical (ST) of 107.
- d. Have between 5 and 10 years of service.
- e. Consistently pass the standard three-event Army Physical Fitness Test (APFT) and consistently meet height/weight standards.
- f. Have normal color vision and no physical limitations.
- g. Able to deploy worldwide.
- h. Possess a valid driver's license and have a favorable driving record.
- i. Able to speak and write clearly.
- j. Possess a sustained and demonstrated level of leadership competency as supported by rater and senior rater comments on all evaluation reports.
- k. No record of disciplinary action or referred evaluations while serving in the military.
- l. Eligible for a Top Secret Clearance based on a Single Scope Background Investigation.

5. Special Agent application. Applicants who meet the eligibility criteria outlined above must contact the CID Recruit Operation Cell at usarmy.belvoir.usacidc.mbx.join-cid@mail.mil to get access the CID Application Portal (CID APP), complete the application process. The CID special agent application will consist of the following documents:

- a. CID Form 560-E (Application for Acceptance as a CID Special Agent).
- b. CID Form 562-E (Commander's Assessment of CID Special Agent Applicant).

- c. CID Form 564-E (Authorization for Release of Information).
 - d. CID Form 565-E (CID Detachment Commander's Interview).
 - e. CID Form 568-E (Realities of the Investigative Profession).
 - f. DD Form 2760 (Qualification to Possess Firearms or Ammunition).
 - g. DD Form 2807-1 (Report of Medical History).
 - h. DD form 2808 (Report of Medical Examination).
 - i. DA form 3822 (Report of Mental Status Evaluation). The mental health evaluation must be completed in accordance with the MEDCOM policy memorandum 5-014, 12 Mar 15, subject: Interim Guidance for Medical and Behavioral Health Examination of Criminal Investigation Command (CID) Applicants.
 - j. Enlisted record brief.
 - k. DA Photo in civilian attire.
 - l. Current credit report.
 - m. Current driving record.
 - n. DA Form 705 (APFT Scorecard) and DA Form 5500/1 (BF Worksheet); if applicable; showing at a minimum the three most current record APFTs.
 - o. SF-86 (Archival copy submitted for initiation of the Single Scope Background Investigation).
6. Warrant Officer application. Once approved as a CID applicant, Soldiers will prepare a warrant officer application. The warrant officer application requirements, packet submission checklist, and WO Recruiting Team points of contact are located on the U.S. Army Recruiting Command (USAREC) website at <https://recruiting.army.mil/ISO/AWOR/>. The applicant has primary responsibility for correctly completing the application, including all supporting documents.
7. Submission procedures. Note application deadlines outlined in paragraph 3 are firm; late submission will not be considered.
- a. The warrant officer application will be submitted by the applicant. Refer to USAREC website at <https://recruiting.army.mil/ISO/AWOR/> for detailed instructions and

requirements.

b. The special agent application will be processed through the CID-APP.

8. Notification. Applicants will receive written notification from HQ, USACIDC regarding their acceptance. Approved CID applicants will be considered by the WO accession board as outlined in paragraph 3 above. Additional information will be sent to the selectees once the board results are released.

9. Training. Those selected for appointment will be scheduled to attend the CID Special Agent Course at Ft Leonard Wood, MO, followed by the Warrant Officer Candidate Course at Ft Rucker, AL and the MOS 311A Warrant Officer Basic Course (WOBC), also at Ft Leonard Wood, MO. Final acceptance in the CID program is contingent upon successful completion of all training and a favorable Single Scope Background Investigation.

10. Appointment to WO incurs a six year active duty service obligation.
