

 - Signal WO must have observed applicant's duty performance for a minimum of 90 days
- ☐ 6 SH College English Composition
 - College English Composition CLEP (not modular) meets requirement
 - TABE @ 12th grade level (12.9 or higher) meets requirement
 - Associate's Degree (or higher) meets requirement
- □ 3 SH College Algebra or higher
 - College Algebra CLEP meets requirement
 - Associate's Degree (or higher) meets requirement

Warrant officers are innovative integrators of emerging technologies, dynamic teachers, confident warfighters, and developers of specialized teams of Soldiers. They support a wide range of Army missions throughout their career. Warrant officers in the Army are accessed with specific levels of technical ability. They refine their technical expertise and develop their leadership and management skills through tiered progressive assignment and education.
