





SHORTER RESIDENCY REQUIREMENTS

 Eligible foreign-born service members require no more than one day of honorable service before they can file their Form N-400, Application for Naturalization. Need to be I55-1 holder (resident).

NO STATE-OF-RESIDENCE REQUIREMENT

 No time minimum restrictions. Foreign-born service members do not have a time minimum to file. Meanwhile civilian applicants must live in the state where they file for mandated time minimum.

WAIVED APPLICATION FEES

Pay no fees. Civilian applicants pay about \$800 to become a U.S.
 citizen meanwhile foreign-born service members do not need to pay.

MILITARY NATURALIZATION STATISTICS

• The Philippines, Mexico, & South Korea are some of the

top countries of birth among those naturalized.

- The Army (including National Guard and Reserves) comprised about two-thirds (63%) of all military naturalizations from 2018 to 2022.
- 50% of applicants are between the ages of 22 30.
- More than 10,600 service members naturalized in 2022.
